Dear brother Woodruff:

I have been engaged for some time in the preparation of a subject index and concordance to the standard church works. About a month ago I finished the part belonging to the Book of Doctrine and Covenants, and have had a corrected copy made of it. In the hope that it may be of use

to the students of the Gospel
I desire to present this
work to the Church.

I shall be very glad to
submit the manuscript to
yourself, or ^{to} anyone suggested
by you, for an examination
to test its merits as a finder
of texts and subjects in the
Book of Doctrine and Cove-
nants. Such an examination
would bring out the weaknesses
of the work and would,
consequently, be very valuable
to me in suggesting the ~~final~~
nature of the final revision.

I shall go to Salt Lake
City for the conference, and

could leave Logan a few days earlier, or stay a few days longer, in order to have the manuscript examined. It would not take more, I think, than an hour, or two, to test its efficiency.

I take the liberty of addressing you because I am not aware of the existence of any committee of the Church to whom I might write upon such a matter.

Through the kindness of Elder J. M. Tanner my work has already been brought to your notice.
